**Topic:** Basic Education and Gender Inequality

**Sponsor:** El Salvador and Kenya

The Economic and Social Council,

*Noting with regret* the terrible history of education and gender inequality in third-world African countries such as Darfur, Sudan, The Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Rwanda,

*Alarmed* by the rising amount of uneducated people and the diminutive number of women in the workforce,

*Seeking* basic instructional rights and equality for men and especially women,

*Welcoming* aid and assistance from the more powerful and wealthy nations of the world, especially those who comprise the Big Five Nations:

1. Calls upon the United Nations to assemble a committee responsible for creating a Ten Year Plan, including timelines, goals, and monetary allotments;
2. Urges the United Nations to enforce said Ten Year Plan which shall gradually provide basic human rights for those people in underdeveloped and poor countries in Africa;
3. Emphasizes the need for all countries to support this Ten Year Plan both politically and monetarily;
4. Requests that the proposed Ten Year Plan supplies running water, food, shelter, education for boys and girls, an equal place in the working field for women, health care, and any other necessities deemed vital by said committee;

5. Encourages delegates to spread knowledge of the deplorable state of living in third-world African nations so as to gain support for said plan;
6. Expresses the hope that over the course of ten years, developing African countries will see a new and improved quality of life that could not have been possible without the proposed Ten Year Plan.
