Topic: Health-Related Millennium Goals

Sponsors: Mexico

The Economic and Social Council,

Aware of the importance that the health-related Millennium Development Goals be met,

Taking note of the 2.1 million people who died of AIDS in 2007,

Noting with horror that in some countries two percent of infants die at birth,

Recognizing that in some countries the maternal mortality rate is two percent,

Taking into account that many countries do not have the resources or economic stability to reach the health-related Millennium Development Goals:

1. Recommends that the World Health Organization prioritize each country in order of levels of aid needed to reach the health-related Millennium Development Goals;
2. Suggests that countries on opposite poles of this list be paired together;
3. Calls upon the countries within each pair to assist each other in reaching the health-related Millennium Development Goals;
4. Further recommends that the World Health Organization monitor the status of each pair's progress and address any problems that arise at a monthly meeting.
