The General Assembly,

Having examined that schools are not always accessible by the available transportation,

Taking note that the women's literacy rate is lower than men's,

Further observing that the citizens' income rate is low,

Recognizing that the United Nations and organizations like UNICEF would have to spend a large amount of money on schooling supplies,

Taking into account that secondary education attendance is low,

Confident that all these issues can be overridden with the proper support mechanism and governmental funding:

1. Calls upon organizations like UNICEF to support and help provide funding to build, refurbish, and provide some sort of transportation to school;
2. Encourages the United Nations and organizations like UNICEF to provide early childhood centers so that no child is left behind when it comes to having the opportunity to receive the foundations of learning;
3. Suggests that these organizations teach the importance of equal rights, entitling all women to receive the same education as men;
4. Further reminds people of all nations that education is an essential part of the future;
5. Fully recommends that the United Nations comes together and reaches out to those in need of proper education.
