Topic: Girl Child

The General Assembly,

Contemplating that in the next ten years 100 million girls will be connubial under the age of eighteen in developing countries,

Deeply conscious that because of malnutrition 75% of teenage girls 15 or over suffer from anemia and that 146,000 girls die from pregnancies and child-birth health defects,

Realizing that girls receive an astonishing 4.4 years less education than boys and that 60% of adolescents that are not enrolled in school are girls,

Further deploring that according to the International Labor Organization over 100 million girls are implicated in compulsory child labor and that they will sometimes have to work for 12 hours consecutively with no lunch break,

1. Encourages the G8 countries to contribute 0.25% of their GDPs to UNICEF, to provide girls in third world countries with access to an enhanced education and health care through UNICEF's services;
2. Further invites countries to develop laws that will prohibit child marriage under the age of 18 who have not already done so;
3. Endorses countries in the third world to use the money from the G8 to subsidize schools and education so that girls do not have to endure forced labor and can get a quality education;
4. Urges an augmented presence of health organizations, such as the Red Cross to endow prevention and education for wide-spread diseases that many young girls suffer from such as HIV/AIDS and furthermore reduces the number of girls who are anemic due to poor nutrition.
