The General Assembly,

Deeply concerned that worldwide, 24% of girls between the ages of six and 11, and 48% of girls between the ages of 12 and 17 were not attending school in 1995,

Recognizing that for each additional year of school, a girl's income would increase by ten to twenty percent,

Noting with deep concern that eighty million girls from the ages of six to eleven lack the opportunity to attend school,

Fully alarmed that pregnancies and child related health problems take the lives of nearly 146,000 teenage girls worldwide each year;

1. Requests that the second millennium goal to achieve universal primary education be addressed to decrease the number of girls not in school. Recommending funding from the military be provided to train teachers and purchase school supplies;
2. Further recommends that girls have more access to education in the four core subjects, and therefore, better opportunities in life;
3. Urges the nations with the top ten GDPs to help with the funding to build schools, and to increase education for not only males, but females;
4. Suggests that part of the education that girls should have access to should be a health class to teach them how to avoid child related, and health related problems.
